 and composed a middle part to carry the
 harmony, derived from the Alto & Tenor
 parts. This makes playing the hymn much
 easier for the new organist or organists
 who are short on time to practice and
 prepare the hymns each week. And it also
 gives confidence to the new organist. To
 fulfill the needs of organists to accompany
 hymns, we offer two books with the hymns
 scored for organ - meaning that when an
 organist plays. We also provide suggested
 stop registration for all 295 hymns, once
 again, to give new organists suggestions
 that assist them in playing. For those who
 also play piano and keyboards for

rehearsals and Mass, this book and the
 standard ORGAN EDITION can be very

 The name Handel means Messiah to most
 people. Sadly, aside from the D minor
 Sarabande, little is known of his keyboard
 works. They are quite different from his
 predominantly melody and bass style of
 writing in Messiah and the operas. They
 sound more like Bach with an added
 degree of drama. In addition the fugues are
 easier to play than Bach's making them
 ideal to learn and play before tackling the
 intricate weaving of voices found
 throughout Bach's works. Many of his
 keyboard pieces were written to be
 played on harpsichord or organ. Many of

the organs were quite small and few had pedalboards. Organs were found in churches but also homes and theaters. From that specific repertoire we have drawn pieces that are best suited for playing at Mass on the organ. The Fugues and Fantasias give you music to play after Mass, the Keyboard Suites music for playing during Mass. Coming from Germany and residing in England, his name appears in a variety of spellings. Roman Catholic church music in England served the needs of a vigorous, vibrant and multi-faceted community that grew from about 70,000 to 1.7 million people during the long nineteenth century. Contemporary literature of all kinds abounds, along with numerous collections of sheet music, some running to hundreds, occasionally even thousands, of separate pieces, many of which have since been forgotten. Apart from compositions in the latest Classical Viennese styles and their successors, much of the music performed constituted a revival or imitation of older musical genres, especially plainchant and Renaissance Polyphony. Furthermore, many pieces that had originally been intended to be performed by professional musicians for the benefit of privileged royal, aristocratic or high ecclesiastical elites were repackaged for rendition by amateurs before largely working or lower middle class congregations, many of them

Irish. However, outside Catholic circles, little attention has been paid to this subject. Consequently, the achievements and widespread popularity of many composers (such as Joseph Egbert Turner, Henry George Nixon or John Richardson) within the English Catholic community have passed largely unnoticed. Worse still, much of the evidence is rapidly disappearing, partly because it no longer seems relevant to the needs of the modern Catholic Church in England. This book provides a framework of the main aspects of Catholic church music in this period, showing how and why it developed in the way it did. Dr Muir sets the music in its historical, liturgical and legal context, pointing to the ways in which the music itself can be used as evidence to throw light on the changing character of English Catholicism. As a result the book will appeal not only to scholars and students working in the field, but also to church musicians, liturgists, historians, ecclesiastics and other interested Catholic and non-Catholic parties.

This organ edition is a companion volume to A Catholic Book of Hymns, a true SATB four-part harmony hymnal for Catholic congregations. Catholics can sing and will sing in harmony if they are given the music to hold in their hands. The organ edition is 7 by 10 inches, larger than the standard pew book,

making the music easier to read when it is on the organ music rack. What's different about this book? Hymn books are scored for singers, not organists or pianists. Books of hymns look strangely different to an organist because it is very different. If you're a singer, every syllable of each word has to have its own note, which, if played on the organ or piano, makes the music choppy. Sung by the human voice, the same line sounds smooth and musical, not at all choppy because the singers' consonants merely alter the vowel sound but don't divide the music with percussion and silence as when you hear the same phrase played on a keyboard. Hymnbook music forces the organist to adapt on the fly, not playing all the notes, playing some - but not all of the repeated notes - into long-held notes. It is a difficult trick to learn to instantaneously convert an entire choir score into organ music in your brain. To some organists this conversion of vocal music to organ becomes second nature, but others are never able to grasp it. As a result, they can grow to dislike playing hymns, finding them a chore and feeling frustrated-especially when they hear another organist and wish they could play like that. There is a simple solution. Play the hymns from a matching organ edition that has all the hymns written out as organ music. And that's exactly what organists say when they discover this organ edition: "Well, now, this looks like organ music. I can play this." One of the benefits of A Catholic Book of Hymns is that all the hymns are free to post and use in streaming and podcasts without payment or permission needed. An organist playing for Catholic Mass must wear at least two hats. It is written in the General Instruction to the Roman Missal that music in the Mass should not delay the Mass. During the Mass, the organ may be played as a solo instrument during the processions, the entrance, offertory and communion as well as other brief processions. These do not call for "traveling music" but solemn music that reflects the nature of the Liturgy. And these brief processions require music that is even shorter in length than the usual procession. Playing an organ before the Mass and a Postlude after Mass are not mentioned in the GIRM nor is a recessional hymn because these are not part of the Mass in any way. When the priest says "the Mass is over..." it is over. At this point an organ postlude is appropriate and Catholic congregations, if they have sung the Mass, have no need to sing yet another hymn so the tradition of organ postludes is returning. Here's the other hat. Instead of searching out more and more short pieces, here you, the organist

may dig through your library and freely play music of any length. Plan when to begin the Prelude so that you complete playing before the start of Mass. The Postlude may be as long as you wish.

While organ teachers delight in assigning lengthy organ pieces to students as their organ skills improve, these pieces, grand as they may be, are for the most part not useful to the Catholic organist who plays for Mass. Many teachers are not aware that composers also wrote easier, as well as shorter, teaching pieces for the organ. These same pieces are also very useful for playing at Mass. In this collection they are entitled *Ubungen* (German) and *Etude* (French), in English - "Exercises." You will find that these are not boring pieces, but rather little gems of music which are fun to play. Included is a section of Easy Organ Postludes for playing after Mass on well-loved Catholic hymn tunes followed by a selection of Wedding organ music. Organ stop registrations for each piece help make this music even more useful.

In addition, Noel has included some more choral anthems. This was an excellent idea in the last issue, and it allows these timeless works to be heard at mass, even where there is not a choir available to sing them in their original form. Their harmonic structure is uniquely suited for inclusion in the sacred liturgy. This set of four books has truly been a labor of love. Noel has maintained its high standard of excellence throughout, both in terms of the music selected, and the quality of the engraving. In this he has been supported and assisted with great diligence and skill by his wife, Ellen Doll Jones, a professional organist of high caliber herself, together with the excellent team of engravers at Frog Music Press. Lewis It's easy to see why the enemies of mankind would hate and fear both sacred silence and sacred music. Both bring joy, spur contemplation, and draw the soul nearer to the Lord. Both have been part of our private prayer as well as our

communal liturgy for thousands of years. The Psalms-biblical songs of praise, supplication, and wonder-have been sung for three thousand years. Naturally, Jesus, His disciples, and later the early Christian community also sang hymns (from the Greek word meaning "songs of praise"), as The New Testament makes clear. We sing because we love, and sung praise elevates our words, takes them out of the realm of the commonplace, and increases our joy. The holy pleasure of singing to God involves the entire person-spirit, heart, mind, and body-and unites us not only with the Divine but also with one another as a worshiping community. This collection of hymns for the singing Catholic congregation exemplifies the best of the genre. These songs are religiously orthodox, beautiful, sacred, and-for the most part-familiar. But here you will also find worthy hymn tunes and texts that are new to you. We present this book to propose not that hymns replace the proper chants for that day's Mass* but live happily alongside them. In most instances the proper chants for processions are the prerogative of cantors and choirs and, as they change very day as part of the Mass aren't practical to be sung by the congregation. Hymns, on the other hand, belong to all the faithful and serve as a key means of the "active participation" spoken of in Vatican II's Constitution on the Sacred Liturgy. Hymns have been sung as an important part of the Liturgy of the Hours for century upon century, so they are nothing new, new only to be sung at Mass. "To promote active participation, the people should be encouraged to take part by means of acclamations, responses, psalmody, antiphons, and songs, as well as by actions, gestures, and bodily attitudes. And at the proper times all should observe a reverent silence." Sacrosanctum Concilium (Constitution on the Sacred Liturgy, Vatican II, 1963), Paragraph 30 In a parish where the scriptures are sung, the introit will accompany the procession of the ministers and the cross. Clergy, choir, and people can then sing a congregational hymn. The same is true at offertory and Communion: hymns can follow the proper chants. And at the conclusion of Mass, a suitable hymn can send the people forth with the praise of Almighty God on their lips. May this book bring joy to all who sing

from it! What is the source of the Sung Antiphons for the Roman liturgy Mass?
