premises of falsifiability as the key component in the scientific method. Mill was also a Member of Parliament and an important figure in liberal political philosophy.

This Student Edition of Brecht's classic dramatisation of the conflict between free enquiry and official ideology features an extensive introduction and commentary that includes a plot summary, discussion of the context, themes, characters, style and language as well as questions for further study and notes on words and phrases in the text. It

is the perfect edition for students of theatre and literature. Along with *Mother Courage*, the character of Galileo is one of Brecht's greatest creations, immensely live, human and complex. Unable to resist his appetite for scientific investigation, Galileo's heretical discoveries about the solar system bring him to the attention of the Inquisition. He is scared into publicly abjuring his theories but, despite his self-contempt, goes on working in private, eventually helping to smuggle his writings out of the country. As an examination of the problems that face not only the scientist but also the whole spirit of free inquiry when brought into conflict with the requirements of government or official ideology, *Life of Galileo* has few equals. Written in exile in 1937-9 and first performed in Zurich in 1943, *Galileo* was first staged in English in 1947 by Joseph Losey in a version jointly prepared by Brecht and Charles Laughton, who played the title role. A History of German Literature Hachette UK

This is really two books in one: a valuable reference resource, and a groundbreaking case study that represents a new approach to constructional semantics. It presents a detailed descriptive survey, using extensive examples collected from the Internet, of German verb constructions in which the expressions *durch* ('through'), *über* ('over'), *unter* ('under'), and *um* ('around') occur either as inseparable verb prefixes or as separable verb particles. Based on that evidence, the author argues that the prefixed verb constructions and particle verb constructions themselves have meaning, and that this meaning involves subjective construal processes rather than objective information. The constructions prompt us to distribute focal attention according to patterns that can be articulated in terms of Talmy's notion of *perspectival modes*. Among the other topics that play an important role in the analysis are incremental themes, reflexive trajectors, fictive motion, *multi-directional paths*, and *accusative landmarks*.

This short story, told in the Gothic tradition represents Poe's first work to be printed, and represents the foundation of what would constitute much of his future work. The tale, set in Hungary, recounts the later years of an interminable feud between two noble houses, the Metzengersteins and the Berlifitzings. This third person narration follows the young orphaned Baron of the Metzengersteins, Frederick, as he inherits his family's fortune and their feud. An ancient

prophecy is all that remains of the origins of this feud, one that has seemingly come true when Frederick is suspected of the murder of the Berlifitzings patriarch. It is this prophecy that drags these two families to a conclusion teeming with tragedy, mystery, violence, madness and the supernatural. For any fans of Poe, mystery or the supernatural it is a must read. Edgar Allan Poe (1809-1849) is a titan of literature. Most famous for his poetry, short stories, and tales of the supernatural and macabre, his body of work continues to resonate to this day. Poe is widely regarded as the inventor of the detective genre and a contributor to the emergence of science fiction, dark romanticism, and weird fiction. His most famous works include "The Raven" (1945), "The Black Cat" (1943), and "The Gold-Bug" (1843).

Linguistik, Note: 1,7, Universität Duisburg-Essen, 13 Quellen im Literaturverzeichnis, Sprache: Deutsch, Abstract: Diese Hausarbeit hat als Untersuchungsschwerpunkt die schulische Analyse von Texten. Analysen sind ein großer Bestandteil des Deutschunterrichts. Schülerinnen und Schüler haben oft große Probleme bei der Analyse von Textsorten. Das Hauptproblem liegt meist darin, dass es unklar ist, wie solche Analysen aufgebaut sein sollten. Im Gegensatz zur einfachen Textwiedergabe, für die die schreibdidaktische Praxis feste Stilnormen etabliert hat, besteht bei den in den Sekundarstufen als Prüfungsaufsatzform sehr üblichen Formen der schriftlichen Analyse, Erschließung und Interpretation von Texten einige Unsicherheit in Bezug auf Form oder Stil des Schülertextes. Aus eigener Erfahrung kann ich sagen, dass es hilfreich ist ein Grund-Aufbau-Gerüst zu haben an dem man sich orientieren kann. In dieser Hausarbeit möchte ich daher ein Grundgerüst zur

Analyse von Texten herstellen und untersuchen. Zunächst werde ich den Schreibprozess untersuchen. Danach werden allgemeine Merkmale einer Analyse diskutiert, wobei der Aufbau von Textanalysen im Mittelpunkt steht. Dabei soll nicht der zu analysierende Text vorrangig sein, sondern die Rezeptions- und Produktionsleistungen, die Lehrer erwarten und Schüler erbringen oder nicht erbringen. Nach diesen Untersuchungen werde ich versuchen ein schülerorientiertes Grundgerüst der Analysen darzustellen. Im Anhang dieser Hausarbeit soll dieses Gerüst auf ein Gedicht praktisch angewandt werden. Ziel dieser Hausarbeit soll es sein, eine Orientierungshilfe zu bieten, wie Texte analysiert werden können. Dabei stehen keine literaturwissenschaftlichen Aspekte, wie zum Beispiel die Interpretation von Gedichten oder Ähnliches, im Vordergrund. Schwerpunkt der Arbeit soll die Struktur der Analyse sein.

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
