Blooms Taxonomy questions Higher-order Questions (HOQ) Higher-order questions are those that the students cannot answer just by simple

recollection or by reading the information “verbatim” from the text. Higher-order questions put advanced cognitive demand on students. They encourage students to think beyond literal questions.
