Breast cancer is a disease requiring multidisciplinary management including surgery, medical and radiation oncology, radiology, pathology, nuclear medicine, genetic counseling, and psychological support. Each member of the team needs to be updated continuously on breast cancer treatment because of its rapidly changing nature. Redefining Beauty Akashic Books

Objectives: to evaluate cervical cancer rate, stage, histology and survival in women under 25 years-old (yo). Methods: we evaluated the cervical cancer registered in 2001-2015 by age-group, stage and histology based in Hospital Registry of Regional Hospital at developed region from Brazil (Campinas-SP), with 5 million people. The statistical analysis was done by Chi-square test, linear trend test, and survival by Kaplan-Meier and log-rank test. Results: 2,041 registries were analyzed: 32 (1.57%) with 15-24yo (only 0.29%, 6 cases up to 20yo), 96 in age-group 25-29yo, 164 in 30-34yo and 1,749 in age >35yo. Cases in age >35yo decreased from 94.6% in 2001-03 to 80.8% in 2013-2015, although not significant ($p=0.078$). There was increased trend in proportion of cancer in younger age-groups (15-24/25-29/30-34yo, $p=0.04/0.014/0.001$). Glandular histology had bigger proportion in women 15-24yo (6/32, 19%; 1/6 cases at age up to 20yo) than 25-29yo (11.5%), 30-34yo (14.0%) ($p=0.008$) Age-group under 25yo had 59% of the cancer in Stage I, while the age 35yo showed 67.1% of cancer in advanced Stages II-IV ($p0.001$). Under 25yo the 5y-Survival rate was 76%, better for age 23-24yo (82%) than

Firstly, the cytotoxicity induced by DPDS and DPS was determined by MTT and Hoechst/PI double labeling assays. DPS showed no cytotoxic effect against any of the breast cancer and non-cancerous cell lines; however, DPDS showed potent cytotoxicity with IC50s in the range 7-18 μM against TNBC cells, and 27 μM against MCF-7s. However, DPDS did not display cytotoxicity towards Her2 positive SKBR3 breast cancer cells. Additionally, DPDS did not show any cytotoxic effect against any of the non-cancerous cell lines, suggesting selectivity anti-cancer action against subtypes of breast cancers. The data also indicated that DPDS displayed higher cytotoxicity towards MDA-MB-231 cells compared to other breast cancer cell lines. YO-PRO-1 dye, a selective indicator of apoptosis was used to identify if the cell death induced by DPDS was through apoptosis in the TNBC cells and ER+ cells used in this study. The analysis indicated that DPDS induced cell death via apoptosis in the range of 5-40 % after 24 h treatment. A time-dependent study also demonstrated that the cytotoxicity and apoptosis were initiated after 8-10 h DPDS treatment in MDA-MB-231 cells. Mechanistically MDA-MB-231 cells showed a 2-fold increase in the activity of caspase-3, detected following DPDS using Ac-DEVD-AMC caspase-3 fluorogenic substrate assay. These results were further supported by a 2-fold increase in cleaved caspase-3 expression in DPDS-treated MDA-MB-231 cells. Western blot analysis also showed that p53 expression was increased 1.5-fold in MDA-MB-231 cells, and 2-fold in MCF-7 cells after 24 h DPDS treatment.

To characterize the cancer pain experience across the adult lifespan using mixed methodology, 15 younger (48.93+/-4.91 y.o.; 39--55 y.o.) and 17 older (72.35+/-9.21 y.o.; 60--90 y.o.) advanced cancer patients with pain were recruited from outpatient clinics at Princess Margaret Hospital. Patients completed the McGill Pain Questionnaire (MPQ) and Brief Pain Inventory (BPI) and individually interviewed regarding pain impact, coping, and management. Constant comparative analysis identified age-related themes. Purposive sampling finalized the sample size. Younger and older patients differed in MPQ pain quality scores ($p \leq 0.04$), but reported similar BPI Pain Severity and Interference ratings. Important age-related patterns were also highlighted. While younger patients described marital relationship strain due to pain, older patients described strengthened relationships. Younger patients expressed pain-related loss and intrusion, but older patients accepted their pain. Additional research into ageing and pain acceptance are required. These findings may contribute to the development of effective pain management strategies across the adult lifespan.
