A record of several exciting and turbulent decades of British and American musical theatre and the transformation of popular music itself, *Unmasked* is ultimately a chronicle of artistic creation. Lloyd Webber looks back at the development of some of his most famous works and illuminates his collaborations with luminaries such as Tim Rice, Robert Stigwood, Harold Prince,
