Doch sein Denken ging über solche Verengung hinaus, wie seine erfolgreichen Bücher zu Kant,

Goethe und zur Theologie belegen. Chamberlain entwarf eine Weltanschauung aus verschlanktem Christentum, klassischer Bildung, Antisemitismus und Rassismus und erleichterte damit Teilen des Bürgertums den Weg zum Nationalsozialismus.
