Derrubado o Muro de Berlim, está aberta a Cortina de Ferro. O Peregrino Secreto é Ned, um agente leal e honesto do período da Guerra Fria, que fez parte dos Serviços Secretos britânicos durante toda a vida. Agora, no final da sua carreira, Ned presta homenagem ao passado da vida de espião e ao seu herói e mestre George Smiley. Convidado de honra para o jantar de finalistas da nova geração de agentes secretos, numa noite inesquecível, Smiley revisita o seu passado e é arrastado para uma viagem sentimental através da sua própria vida, desde o recrutamento à iminente aposentação. O resultado é uma deslumbrante série de episódios - em parte cómicos, em parte líricos, em parte trágicos -, cada um deles constituindo um marco ao longo do percurso deste «peregrino secreto». Manuseando a sua habitual magia, le Carré mistura um esplêndido conjunto de novos personagens aos velhos heróis dos seus romances: George Smiley, Toby Esterhase, Bill Haydon e Ned, de *A Casa da Rússia*, entre muitos outros, cada qual com o seu momento nesse cortejo sem fim e sempre novo dos Serviços

Secretos, que nas mãos de le Carré é, ao fim e ao cabo, o local mais recôndito das nossas vidas comuns. John le Carré nasceu em 1931. Estudou em Berna e Oxford, foi professor em Eton e trabalhou episodicamente nos Serviços Secretos britânicos durante a Guerra Fria – esteve durante cinco anos ligado ao Ministério dos Negócios Estrangeiros, sendo primeiro secretário da Embaixada Britânica em Bona e, posteriormente, cônsul político em Hamburgo. Começou a sua carreira literária em 1961, tendo-se tornado um escritor mundialmente reconhecido com o seu terceiro livro, *O Espião Que Saiu do Frio*. A consagração ficou estabelecida depois de ser publicada a célebre trilogia de Smiley: *A Toupeira*, *The Honourable Schoolboy* e *A Gente de Smiley*.

J.M.G. Le Clézio et la métaphore exotique propose une analyse détaillée et approfondie de l'oeuvre de J.M.G. Le Clézio, prix Nobel de littérature 2008. La question de la « métaphore exotique » sert ici de fil conducteur et permet d'éclairer le corpus leclézien d'un triple point de vue textuel, anthropologique et psychanalytique. L'inscription problématique de l'espace et du voyage domine en effet toute la production littéraire de Le Clézio; et cette inscription s'accompagne d'une certaine ambiguïté générique. D'une part l'analyse montre que l'écriture du voyage fonctionne chez Le Clézio, comme chez Segalen, comme une « écriture des limites », c'est-à-dire comme un déplacement du sujet et du sens. Mais d'autre part l'analyse montre

que l'écriture du voyage dessine chez Le Clézio un rapport singulier et ambivalent à l'espace postmoderne, au désenchantement du monde et à la disparition des grands mythes fondateurs, interrogeant l'acte même de la création littéraire. A la fois humaniste et antidogmatique, l'oeuvre de J.M.G. Le Clézio se situe ainsi de façon originale dans les marges des grands mouvements littéraires du XXe et du XXIe siècle, du Nouveau Roman des années 60 à la « littérature-monde » d'aujourd'hui.

The literature of terror and horror continues to fascinate readers both casual and more critical, and it has long been recognised as an international, not merely British, phenomenon. This study provides an in-depth and text-based analysis of Gothic fiction in France and Germany from earlier literary traditions, through the influence of the English Gothic novel, to an extraordinary popularity and dominance by the end of the eighteenth century. It examines how some of the motifs most closely associated with the Gothic - secret societies, the supernatural and suspense, among others - are the product of an uncertain age, and how the use of those motifs differed not just across languages and borders, which in

fact the Gothic often crossed with ease, but according to the views, concerns and sometimes insecurities of individual authors. What emerges is a complex genre more diverse than any 'list of Gothic ingredients' would have us believe. Many of the notions and devices explored by the French and German Gothic then continue to intrigue, disturb and unsettle today.

Schwann Opus Kohlhammer Verlag Ned is the Secret Pilgrim, a loyal soldier of the Cold War, who has been in British Intelligence all his adult life. Now, just as retirement is within his grasp, he is forced by the explosions of change to revisit his secret years and face the questions that have haunted him for thirty years.

The Secret Pilgrim Getty Publications Apollinaire's two great collections of poetry, *Alcools* and *Calligrammes*, made his reputation, and they include love poems as well as the war poetry for which he is best known. Apollinaire coined the word 'surrealism'. This book covers the full range of Apollinaire's career, and includes some of the poet's inventive pictorial calligrams. The introduction and notes explore his seminal role in the culture of the twentieth century.

The Singer's Repertoire, Part IV

The decades following the 1973 publication of Alessandro Conti's *Storia del Restauro* have seen considerable scholarly interest in the development of restoration in France in the second half of the eighteenth century. A number of technical treatises and biographies of restorers have offered insight into restoration practice. *The Restoration of Paintings in Paris, 1750-1815*, however, is the first book to situate this work within the broader historical and philosophical contexts of the time. Drawing on previously unpublished

primary material from archives in Paris, Berlin, Rome, and Venice, Noémie Étienne combines art history with anthropology and sociology to survey the waning decades of the Ancien Régime and early post- Revolution France. Initial chapters present the diversity of restoration practice, encompassing not only royal institutions and the Louvre museum but also private art dealers, artists, and craftsmen, and examine questions of trade secrecy and the changing role of the restorer. Following chapters address the influence of restoration and exhibition on the aesthetic understanding of paintings as material objects. The book closes with a discussion of the institutional and political uses of restoration, along with an art historical consideration of such key concepts as authenticity, originality, and stability of artworks, emphasizing the multilayered dimension of paintings by such important artists as Titian and Raphael. There is also a useful dictionary of the main restorers active in France between 1750 and 1815.
