In its report on Rail Fares and Franchises, the Committee concludes that the fare increases, service reductions and staff cuts seen in 2009 are unacceptable practices which the Government must take steps to prevent. Fare rises of more than 11 per cent on some routes when inflation is close to zero are not acceptable. In its key recommendations on franchises the Committee calls for: (a) Government to attempt different forms of franchising, keeping the 'lucrative' East Coast Main Line franchise in the public sector to provide a benchmark against which to compare the performance of other types of franchises; (b) franchises to be let on a longer term basis which will remove

perverse incentives that currently encourage short-term cost-cutting measures that reduce service quality; (c) all franchises to be made more passenger-focused over time. With regard to fares the Committee: (a) criticises the six month gap between the benchmark RPI and subsequent fare rises because it permits price hikes at the worst time and increases out of all proportion to trends in the real economy; (b) concludes that fare structures remain too complex; (c) welcomes the Secretary of State's confirmation that the RPI+1 per cent formula will apply for 2010 fares such that regulated fares could decrease next year.

Conventional wisdom says that the world is heading for a major water crisis. By 2050, global population will increase from 7 billion to a staggering 9.5 billion and the demands this will place on food and water systems will inevitably push river basins over the edge. The findings from this book present a different picture. While it is convenient to visualize an inevitable global water and food crisis in which increasing demands result in increasing poverty, food insecurity and conflict, the reality is far more nuanced and revolves around the

politics of equitable and sustainable development of resources. The first part of this book provides detailed insight into conditions of water flows within nine river basins. In the second part, authors summarize and re-analyze the outcome of the nine basins, providing a coherent global picture of water, water productivity and development. They assess the impacts of variations of these attributes on development and approaches for poverty alleviation, and explore the institutional factors that support or obstruct change. How people will manage river systems while protecting vital ecosystem functions will make the difference between catastrophe and survival. As Prof Asit Biswas points out, "... the world is facing a water crisis not because of physical

scarcity of water but because of poor management practices in nearly all countries of the world." The book is based on the four years (2006-2010) of extensive research into the state of ten of the world's major river basins carried out under the CGIAR Challenge Program for Water and Food's Basin Focal Project. In this report the Environment, Food and Rural Affairs Committee welcomes the findings of the independent Task Force on Farming Regulation and calls on Defra to implement its recommendations promptly. In May 2011, the independent Farming Regulation Task Force completed a review of Defra's farming and food related regulations - the first of

its kind across Whitehall (<http://www.defra.gov.uk/publications/files/pb13527-farm-reg-task-report.pdf>). The Committee congratulates the Task Force for striking a successful balance between upholding standards and over-zealous regulation and eagerly awaits a clear timetable of practical steps to cut back the overly burdensome regulations that threaten to stifle English farm businesses. Defra estimates the direct cost of current regulation is upwards of £5bn each year. Yet over half of all Defra's regulations come from EU requirements. It is essential that Defra engages earlier and more proactively in Europe to reduce the cost burden

imposed by EU regulations in future. The report also calls for MPs to be given greater powers to scrutinise legislation establishing new regulations.
