It is clear that the problem is not being dealt with in any effective manner. At the invitation of the Canadian Hepatic Foundation, many of the world's experts gathered in Toronto, May 14-15 1976, to focus attention on one of the most important aspects of the alcohol problem - alcohol induced liver damage.
