L'autore ritiene che questi due re vissero e regnarono in Egitto, e che, come i loro antenati Patriarchi, fossero dei faraoni appartenenti al potente impero Hyksos, che fondarono la XV dinastia ed anche la XXII, entrambe governate da sovrani appartenevano alla discendenza di Terach, il padre di Abramo. Questi importanti personaggi che infine riuscirono ad impadronirsi del potere in Egitto dovevano già avere conquistato un vasto territorio che andava dalla Mesopotamia al fiume Nilo, comprendenti anche il regno di Edom in Transgiordania, dove governarono Seir, che corrispondeva ad Abramo, il figlio Ismaele ed Esaù, che ereditò il trono prendendo in sposa una figlia di Ismaele, che portava una titolatura che comprendeva Maaca-Bashemat.

There are two primary reasons why translation studies cannot ignore the ideological debate. Historically, translation has always been a site for ideological clashes. In addition, globalization is now setting off translational mechanisms even within monolingual artifacts, and this calls for the expertise of translation scholars. Apropòs of Ideology aims to contribute to the broader discussion of ideology by providing a forum for debating ideological issues in translation as well as by bringing together, within the pages of a single volume, different types of translation research, informed by very different research ideologies. Традиция чтения Евангелия от Иоанна восходит к X веку. Считается, что она была инициирована константинопольским Патриархом. Сначала текст читался на двух языках - латинском и греческом. Позднее был добавлен древнееврейский, как третий из языков, на которых была сделана надпись на кресте "Иисус Назорей - царь Иудейский". Когда в литургии начали использовать местные языки, этот текст стал читаться и на них. Сейчас принято читать пасхальное Евангелие на этих трех древних и некоторых современных языках. Чтение символизирует универсальность Евангелия, которое обращено ко всем народам: благая весть о Христе, чья победа над смертью празднуется в Пасхальную ночь, должна быть услышана на всех языках мира.
