Here death always stands in close relation to fear, though there are only two of his short stories namely A Little Place off Edgware Road and Proof Positive, which by their settings and characters create a certain kind of horror and revulsion. The latter, M. G. Brennan wrote, is "[...] dealing with the polarities of life and death [...]" (28) and has a rather ironical and mystic notion towards the theme.
