The universities immediately began to organize the selection and transfer of refugee students from the Austrian camps to Britain, to interview them, allocate places for them and set up the necessary English language classes. Nearly one thousand potential students were interviewed, five hundred of whom were placed in higher educational institution all

over the country. Well over the half of these students obtained degrees, and an unusually high proportion went on to gain higher degrees.
