Wer eine neue Sprache lernt, kommt ums monotone Vokabellernen nicht herum. Normalerweise. Anders bei der innovativen LaGeiss-Methode von Helmut Lange und Oliver Geisselhart. Diese ist so einfach wie genial: Alle Lateinvokabeln sind gehirn-gerecht als Bild bzw. kleines Filmchen mit ihrer Übersetzung verknüpft. Die Begriffe werden durch einfaches Lesen und die gedankliche Visualisierung dieser meist sehr lustigen Szenen mühelos erlernt. 100 bis 200 Vokabeln lassen sich so in nur einer Stunde einprägen und behalten. Um etwa die deutsche Bedeutung "liegen" des lateinischen Wortes "cubare" leichter zu lernen, stellt man sich eine Kuh vor, die auf einer Bahre liegt. Ein kurioses Bild, das von nun an unauslöschlich an die Bedeutung geknüpft ist. Auch der fünfte Band des erfolgreichen Autorenduos zeigt eindrucksvoll, wie unterhaltsam Sprachenlernen sein kann. Das Buch orientiert sich bei der Auswahl der Vokabeln an dem Wortschatz, der bundesweit an den Schulen für das Latein gelehrt wird.

The publication of Edward Said's *Orientalism* in 1978 marks the inception of orientalism as a discourse. Since then, *Orientalism* has remained highly polemical and has become a widely employed epistemological tool. Three decades on, this volume sets out to survey, analyse and revisit the state of the Orientalist debate, both past and present. The leitmotiv of this book is its emphasis on an intimate connection between art, land and voyage. In the past few decades, scientists of human nature—including experimental and cognitive psychologists, neuroscientists, evolutionary theorists, and behavioral economists—have explored the way we arrive at moral judgments. They have called into question commonplaces about character and offered troubling explanations for various moral intuitions. Research like this may help explain what, in fact, we do and feel. But can it tell us what we ought to do or feel? In *Experiments in Ethics*, the philosopher Kwame Anthony Appiah explores how the new empirical moral psychology relates to the age-old project of philosophical ethics. Some moral theorists hold that the realm of morality must be autonomous of the sciences; others maintain that science undermines the authority of moral reasons. Appiah elaborates a vision of naturalism that resists both temptations. He traces an intellectual genealogy of the burgeoning discipline of "experimental philosophy," provides a balanced, lucid account of the work being done in this controversial and increasingly influential field, and offers a fresh way of thinking about ethics in the classical tradition. Appiah urges that the relation between empirical research and morality, now so often antagonistic, should be seen in terms of dialogue, not contest. And he shows how experimental philosophy, far from being something new, is

actually as old as philosophy itself. Beyond illuminating debates about the connection between psychology and ethics, intuition and theory, his book helps us to rethink the very nature of the philosophical enterprise.

Questions of identity, policy, and exchange make it difficult to determine the "place" of art, and often the art itself results from these conflicts of geography and culture.
